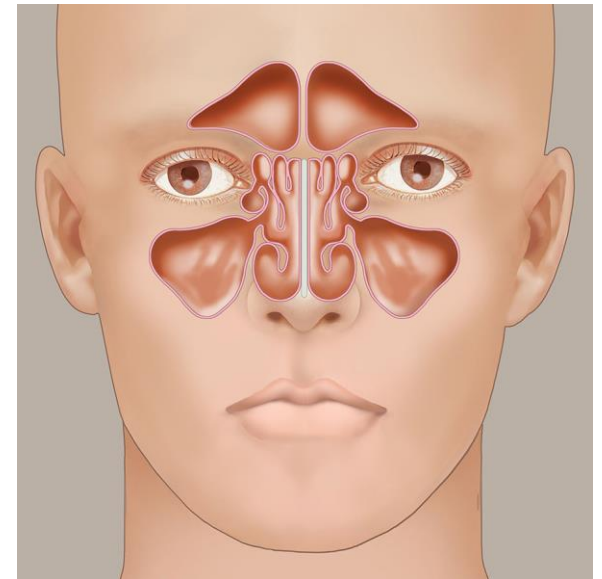

Overview
